INTERMEDIATE TRAILS

1 L'Orée Trail

From Main resort entrance car park $\Delta 0\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 525\text{ m}$

A lovely forest trail that leads you down to the old village.

2 Camping Trail

From Main resort entrance car park or ski school $\Delta 50\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 390\text{ m}$

A pleasant forest trail, ideal for guests staying at the campsite as well as anyone who enjoys quiet woodland walks.

3 Golf Trail (Out-and-back or loop via Les Eucherts)

From Résidence Les Marmottons (centre) $\Delta 100\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 1,3\text{ km}$

A beautiful walk with varied scenery: forest ascent and wide-open views across the Haute-Tarentaise valley. Take the opportunity to enjoy a warm drink at L'Antigel or a relaxing break on the terrace at Le Paradis.

4 Panoramic Mont Blanc 4

From Roches Noires chairlift top station $\Delta 128\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 1,4\text{ km}$

An easy route leading to a historic site: the remains of the Redoute fort. Don't forget your souvenir photo on the Panoramic footbridge, with Mont Blanc as the backdrop.

5 Bout de la Route Trail

From Les Eucherts $\Delta 166\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 3\text{ km}$

A beautiful walk overlooking the Combe des Moulins, taking you to the foot of the Fort chairlift, where you'll enjoy exceptional views of Mont Blanc. Warm up on the terraces of Tout Poudre or La Traversette, perfect for a drink or a crêpe.

A Shepherds' Trail (Ungroomed)

From After the last bend at Le Gollot $\Delta 40\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 1,2\text{ km}$

From the picturesque Gollot area, explore snowy undergrowth

before reaching the meadows below the old village, dominated by the Sainte Jeanne d'Arc chapel.

B Little Trapper's Trail (Ungroomed)

From Middle of the Chemin de la Forêt $\Delta 80\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 1,6\text{ km}$

With snowshoes on, explore La Rosière's forest in search of animal tracks. Stop by the Tourist Office beforehand to pick up the activity booklet or to note your discoveries. If you truly have the spirit of a mountain trapper, you'll be able to identify the tracks – and you'll leave with a little surprise.

DIFFICULT TRAILS

1 Panoramic Mont Blanc 1-2-3

From Les Eucherts $\Delta 488\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 3\text{ km}$

A demanding and steep trail. Although groomed, snowshoes are often helpful. In the heart of the ski area, enjoy wide-open landscapes and admire skiers carving their lines.

2 Hay Trail (Out-and-back, ungroomed)

From First bend after the campsite $\Delta 260\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 1,8\text{ km}$

Discover the hamlet of Le Châtelard, crowned by its emblematic chapel.

3 Schoolchildren's Trail (Ungroomed)

From Le Châtelard $\Delta 405\text{ m}$ $\text{E} 5,7\text{ km}$

This loop will take you through some of the hamlets in the municipality of Montvalezan, with their traditional dwellings. Chapels, forests and tranquillity will be the order of the day.

The chairlifts named on the map are accessible on foot.
